At-Large Delegate Hedrick reported that things are going back to normal, and more residents have stopped wearing masks. Schools are getting out for the summer soon.

Commissioner Johnson mentioned Washington County is holding their annual Black Bear Festival on June 5th. Commissioner Johnson mentioned a meeting on June 2 with Senator Thom Tillis. Commissioner Johnson mentioned the county needs a new school.

At-Large Delegate Hoggard reported on the fuel crisis. At-Large Delegate Hoggard praised the citizens for their peaceful demeanor conducting their right to assembly.

Commissioner Hofler reported Gates County ended their County State of Emergency. Gates County is working on their budget.

Commissioner Davis reported Tyrell County is in the budget process. Commissioner Davis reported having to increase water rates due to the Prison still not operating at full capacity.

Commissioner Riggs reported Camden County is in the budget process.

Commissioner Robert Kirby congratulated Camden County's softball team. Commissioner Kirby reported Chowan County is in the budget process and in the process of designing a new high school.

Chairperson Griffin reported Pasquotank County is in the budget process, and also mentioned water issues in the County.
